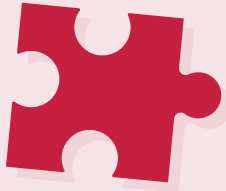
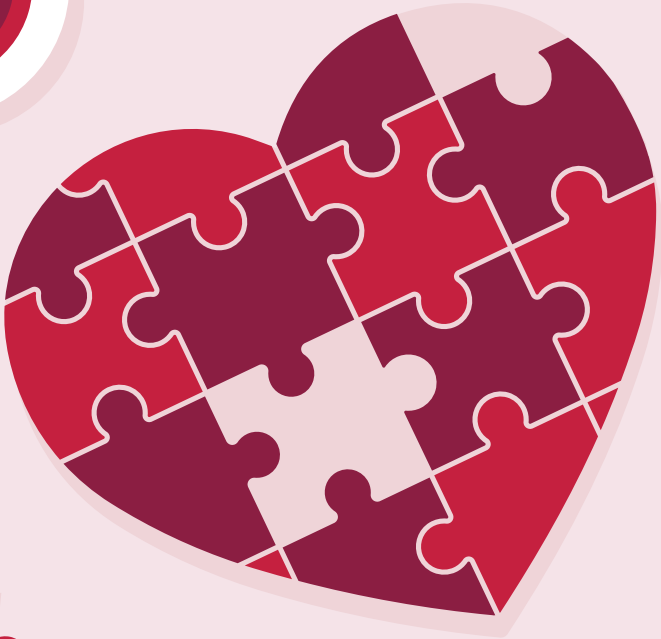

In 2025, we made meaningful progress toward creating a world where every ambition is possible. Through dedicated support and impactful initiatives, we empowered our communities and helped individuals pursue their goals. Through employee contributions and volunteering, and support from CIBC Foundation, we contributed \$144 million in corporate and employee giving to charities, non-profits and community organizations.

Meanwhile, CIBC Foundation reached its targeted milestone of \$155 million through a combination of donations from CIBC and investment growth. These funds help support cancer research, childhood development, community building, and improving the financial health and wellbeing of members of our communities.

Collectively, CIBC supported over 5,000 causes and our employees volunteered over 136,000 hours in 2025.
