Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Investment Objective: CIBC Global Growth ETF (the *CIBC ETF*) seeks to generate long-term capital growth by investing in a diversified portfolio consisting primarily of equity securities of companies located anywhere in the world. Exposure to these types of securities will be obtained by investing primarily in Renaissance Global Growth Fund (or its successor fund), and/or by investing directly in the securities.

Investment Strategies: The CIBC ETF invests all or substantially all of its assets in units of the Renaissance Global Growth Fund (or its successor fund) (*Underlying Fund*). The Underlying Fund is managed by the Manager, and sub-advised by Walter Scott & Partners Limited.

Risk

The CIBC ETF is a global equity ETF that is suitable for long term investors who can tolerate medium investment risk.

For the period ended December 31, 2024, the CIBC ETF's overall level of risk remained as discussed in the prospectus.

Results of Operations

The CIBC ETF's portfolio advisor is CIBC Asset Management Inc. (*CAMI* or the *Portfolio Advisor*). The CIBC ETF primarily invests in units of Renaissance Global Growth Fund (the *Underlying Fund*), which is sub-advised by Walter Scott & Partners Limited (the *Sub-Advisor*).

The commentary that follows provides a summary of the results of operations for the Underlying Fund for the year ended December 31, 2024. All dollar figures are expressed in thousands, unless otherwise indicated.

The CIBC ETF's net asset value increased by 36% during the period, from \$79,119 as at December 31, 2023 to \$107,497 as at December 31, 2024. Net sales of \$14,421 and positive investment performance resulted in an overall increase in net asset value.

The CIBC ETF posted a return of 17.2% for the period. The CIBC ETF's benchmark, the MSCI World Index (the *benchmark*), returned 30.0% for the same period. The CIBC ETF's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, unlike the benchmark's return.

Global equity markets rose over the period, reflecting ongoing global economic resilience, a slower pace of inflation, and the lowering of interest rates by the U.S. Federal Reserve Board and the European Central Bank. However, economic growth was not uniform, with the U.S. exhibiting relatively resilient growth, while Europe and Japan remained tepid. Consumer spending helped prop up many economies, but manufacturing activity was lacklustre. There were signs that markets were paying more attention to large budget deficits, as evidenced by events in France.

Investors were wary of China given concerns over the property market, re-shoring away from China and U.S./China tensions. Despite the country's stimulus measures, improving performance in a number of China-related companies was largely ignored.

Equity market performance was concentrated in the U.S., with the "Magnificent Seven" stocks having a significant effect on market returns.

Stock selection in the U.S. and within the information technology and consumer discretionary sectors detracted from the CIBC ETF's performance. Overweight holdings in Adobe Inc. and L'Oréal SA were the largest individual detractors from performance. Adobe underperformed as investors were disappointed with the company's pace of artificial intelligence (*AI*) monetization. L'Oréal was affected by the slowdown in growth in China. In addition, some of the company's beauty products in the U.S. negatively affected its performance in the latter part of the year.

Stock selection in emerging markets and within the health care sector contributed to performance. The largest individual contributors to performance included Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Co. Ltd. (*TSMC*) and overweight holdings in Amphenol Corp. and Intuitive Surgical Inc.

TSMC saw strong growth in 2024, benefiting from Al-related demand. The company has an effective monopoly in the manufacture of Al-related chips, and its Al revenues rose three-fold over the year. Amphenol reported growth in sales, profits and orders. It benefitted from Al momentum via its sales into the data centre market. Intuitive

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Surgical had a robust year operationally, with procedures, systems, and instrument and accessory sales seeing solid growth.

The Sub-Advisor added a new holding in Copart Inc., the market leader in the automotive salvage and auction industry in the U.S. The growth of its market is underpinned by the rising salvage rate, which has increased due to greater vehicle complexity and an aging U.S. car fleet.

Following a cyclical downturn in its end markets, the Sub-Advisor took the opportunity to add a holding in Ferguson PLC. A new holding in Mettler-Toledo International Inc. was purchased based on its competitive advantages. In addition to delivering consistent revenue growth over the long term, the company has a record of improving profitability.

An existing holding in AIA Group Ltd. was increased as its shares came under pressure, despite its strong performance and record new business activity. O'Reilly Automotive Inc. was increased for its recessionary resilient qualities, evidenced by more than 30 years of consecutive comparable sales growth. Following a period of share price weakness relating to a temporarily soft end market, the Sub-Advisor increased a holding in ASML Holding NV.

A holding in Cognex Corp. was eliminated as a result of disappointing performance, driven by the slowdown of global industrial activity. Kone OYJ was sold as its growth is being impacted by a significant construction downturn, particularly in China, its largest market. The Sub-Advisor also sold The Walt Disney Co. It has taken steps to right-size its loss-making streaming media business, but the impending transition of its flagship ESPN franchise from its legacy linear ecosystem to a streaming world holds more risk.

Holdings in Amphenol Corp., Novo Nordisk AS and TSMC were trimmed after strong share price performance.

Recent Developments

The level of geopolitical risk disrupted the global economy and financial markets in unprecedented and unpredictable ways. This has resulted in significant volatility and uncertainty in financial markets. It is unclear what further actions may be taken by governments and the resulting impact on global economies, businesses and financial markets. Inflation has increased in many markets across the globe, leading central banks to raise interest rates in order to counter rapidly rising prices. These factors may adversely affect the CIBC ETF's performance. The Manager continues to monitor ongoing developments and the impact to investment strategies.

Related Party Transactions

Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce (*CIBC*) and its affiliates have the following roles and responsibilities with respect to the CIBC ETF, and receive the fees described below in connection with their roles and responsibilities.

Manager, Trustee, and Portfolio Advisor of the CIBC ETF CAMI, a wholly-owned subsidiary of CIBC, is the CIBC ETF's Manager, Trustee, and Portfolio Advisor. CAMI receives management fees with respect to the CIBC ETF's day-to-day business and operations, calculated based on the net asset value of units of the CIBC ETF as described in Management Fees section. As Trustee, CAMI holds title to the CIBC ETF's property (cash and securities) on behalf of its

unitholders. As Portfolio Advisor, CAMI provides, or arranges to provide for, investment advice and portfolio management services to the CIBC ETF. CAMI also compensates dealers in connection with their marketing activities regarding the CIBC ETF. From time to time, CAMI may invest in units of the CIBC ETF.

Designated Broker and Dealer

CAMI has entered into an agreement with CIBC World Markets Inc. (CIBC WM), an affiliate of CAMI, to act as designated broker and dealer for distribution of the CIBC ETF, on terms and conditions that are comparable to arm's length agreements in the exchange traded funds industry.

Brokerage Arrangements and Soft Dollars

The Portfolio Advisor makes decisions, including the selection of markets and dealers and the negotiation of commissions, with respect to the purchase and sale of portfolio securities, certain derivative products and the execution of portfolio transactions. Brokerage business may be allocated by the Portfolio Advisor to CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp., each a subsidiary of CIBC. CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp. may also earn spreads on the sale of fixed income and other securities, and certain derivative products to the CIBC ETF. A spread is the difference between the bid and ask prices for a security in the applicable marketplace, with respect to the execution of portfolio transactions. The spread will differ based upon various factors such as the nature and liquidity of the security.

Dealers, including CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp., may furnish goods and services, other than order execution, to the Portfolio Advisor when they process trades through them (referred to in the industry as "soft-dollar" arrangements). These goods and services are paid for with a portion of the brokerage commissions and assist the Portfolio Advisor with investment decision-making services for the CIBC ETF or relate directly to the execution of portfolio transactions on behalf of the CIBC ETF. Any soft dollar arrangements shall be in compliance with applicable laws.

During the period, the CIBC ETF did not pay any brokerage commissions or other fees to CIBC WM or CIBC World Markets Corp. Spreads associated with fixed income and other securities are not ascertainable and, for that reason, cannot be included when determining these amounts.

CIBC ETF Transactions

The CIBC ETF may enter into one or more of the following transactions (the *Related Party Transactions*) in reliance on the standing instructions issued by the Independent Review Committee (the *IRC*):

- to invest in or hold equity securities of CIBC or issuers related to the Portfolio Advisor;
- to invest in or hold non-exchange-traded debt securities of CIBC or an issuer related to CIBC in a primary offering and in the secondary market:
- to make an investment in the securities of an issuer for which CIBC WM, CIBC World Markets Corp., or any affiliate of CIBC (a "Related Dealer" or the "Related Dealers") acts as an underwriter during the offering of the securities or at any time during the 60-day period following the completion of the offering of such securities, including in respect of equity securities of a reporting issuer pursuant to a

"private placement" offering (an offering under exemptions from the prospectus requirements) and for the 60-day period following the completion of the offering, in each case in accordance with certain conditions;

- to purchase equity and debt securities from, or sell them to, a Related Dealer, where it is acting as principal;
- undertake currency and currency derivative transactions where a Related Dealer is the counterparty;
- to purchase securities from, or sell securities to, another investment fund or a managed account managed by the Manager or an affiliate (the inter-fund trades or cross-trades), subject to certain conditions; and
- to engage in in-specie transfers by receiving portfolio securities from, or delivering portfolio securities to, a managed account or another investment fund managed by the Manager or an affiliate in respect of a purchase or redemption of Units of the CIBC ETF, subject to certain conditions.

At least annually, the IRC reviews the Related Party Transactions for which they have issued standing instructions. The IRC is required to advise the Canadian securities regulatory authorities, after a matter has been referred or reported to the IRC by the Manager, if it determines that an investment decision was not made in accordance with a condition imposed by securities legislation or the IRC in any Related Party Transactions requiring its approval.

Custodian

CIBC Mellon Trust Company is the custodian of the CIBC ETF (the *Custodian*). The Custodian holds cash, securities, and other assets of the CIBC ETF and ensures that those assets are kept separate from any other cash, securities, or other assets that the custodian might be holding. The Custodian also provides other services to the CIBC ETF including record-keeping and processing of foreign exchange transactions. The fees and spreads for the services of the Custodian are paid by the Manager. CIBC owns a 50% interest in the Custodian.

Service Provider

The Custodian also provides certain services to the CIBC ETF, including securities lending, fund accounting and reporting, and portfolio valuation. The Manager receives a fixed administration fee from the Fund, in return, the Manager pays certain operating expenses which includes custodial fees (including all applicable taxes) and the fees for fund accounting, reporting, and fund valuation (including all applicable taxes) to CIBC Mellon Trust Company. Where applicable, securities lending fees are applied against the revenue received by the Fund.

- The portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the portfolio advisor and/or portfolio sub-advisor manages the portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the CIBC ETF buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by the CIBC ETF in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the CIBC ETF.

Management Fees

The CIBC ETF pays CAMI an annual management fee to cover the costs of managing the CIBC ETF. Management fees are based on the CIBC ETF's net asset value and are calculated daily and paid monthly. Management fees are paid to CAMI in consideration for providing, or arranging for the provision of, management, distribution, and portfolio advisory services. Advertising and promotional expenses, and office overhead expenses related to the Manager's activities and the fees of the Portfolio Advisor are paid by CAMI out of the management fees received from the CIBC ETFs. The CIBC ETF is required to pay applicable taxes on the management fees paid to CAMI. Refer to the CIBC ETF's prospectus for the annual management fee rate.

For the period ended December 31, 2024, 100% of the management fees collected from the CIBC ETF was attributable to general administration and investment advice.


Past Performance
