Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Investment Objective: CIBC Private Wealth Canadian Dividend Growth Pool (the *Pool*) aims to generate income and potential capital growth by investing primarily in Canadian equity securities that produce dividend income.

Investment Strategies: The Pool is guided by a model portfolio that uses a multi-disciplined, active investment process that leverages the strengths of fundamental, quantitative and technical analysis.

Risk

The Pool is a Canadian dividend & income equity fund that is suitable for long term investors who can tolerate medium investment risk.

For the period ended August 31, 2024, the Pool's overall level of risk remained as discussed in the simplified prospectus.

Results of Operations

The Pool's portfolio sub-advisor is CIBC Wood Gundy, a division of CIBC World Markets Inc. (the *Sub-Advisor*). The commentary that follows provides a summary of the results of operations for the period ended August 31, 2024. All dollar figures are expressed in thousands, unless otherwise indicated.

The Pool's net asset value increased by 165% during the period, from \$8,930 as at August 31, 2023 to \$23,703 as at August 31, 2024. Net sales of \$12,316 and positive investment performance resulted in an overall increase in net asset value.

Series F units of the Pool posted a return of 15.7% for the period. The Pool's benchmark, the S&P/TSX Composite Dividend Index (the *benchmark*), returned 19.4% for the same period. The Pool's return is after the deduction of fees and expenses, unlike the benchmark's return. See the section *Past Performance* for the returns of other series of units offered by the Pool.

The Bank of Canada (the *BoC*) lowered its policy rate by 0.25% at each of its June and July meetings. Interest rates were volatile during the period. The Canadian economy weakened, and the unemployment rate trended upward. Amid a more challenging macroeconomic environment, consumers remained cautious about spending, with a shift away from

discretionary categories. Inflation in Canada eased toward the BoC's target level.

Commodity prices were mixed, with gold prices ending the period near record highs. In contrast, oil prices declined later in the period amid concerns around slowing demand.

Stock selection in the financials, consumer discretionary and industrials sectors detracted from the Pool's performance. A holding in Bank of Montreal detracted from performance as it underperformed its peers due to outsized credit losses and declining earnings estimates. The Toronto-Dominion Bank also detracted from the Pool's performance as it was impacted by the uncertainty surrounding its regulatory issues in the U.S.

Stock selection in the utilities and energy sectors contributed to the Pool's performance, as did an overweight allocation to pipeline companies, which benefited from declining interest rates. Individual contributors to the Pool's performance included AltaGas Ltd., Loblaw Cos. Ltd. and an overweight holding in TC Energy Corp. AltaGas benefited from its midstream segment, which experienced strong export volumes. Loblaw benefited from its defensive characteristics, including its leading market position, strong online presence, private labels and loyalty program. TC Energy generated strong gains as it made progress on asset sales and reducing debt.

The Sub-Advisor added a new holding in Brookfield Asset Management Inc. based on a favourable environment for the alternative asset management industry and an outlook for robust dividend growth. WSP Global Inc. was added to the Pool because it is a beneficiary of the growth in global infrastructure spending. The company has a solid backlog that should support growth, while margins are also expected to continue to improve.

An existing holding in Wheaton Precious Metals Corp. was increased based on a positive outlook for precious metals prices. Teck Resources Ltd. was increased given a favourable outlook for copper prices and progress on the company's strategic repositioning focused on base metals. TC Energy was increased for its attractive valuation and as the Sub-Advisor's confidence in the company's strategy increased.

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The Pool's holding in Franco-Nevada Corp. was eliminated given the uncertainty around its largest asset, the Cobre Panama gold and silver stream. Allied Properties REIT was sold given a weakening market and negative investor sentiment toward the office sub-sector. Nutrien Ltd. was eliminated as the agriculture market is expected to remain rangebound in the near term. A holding in Magna International Inc. was sold based on continued challenges in the auto industry.

The Pool's holding in BCE Inc. was reduced given competitive industry dynamics and concerns over the company's elevated dividend payout ratio. RioCan REIT was trimmed to manage the holding's size, and the proceeds were used to increase the Pool's holding in Canadian Apartment Properties REIT given favourable supply/demand dynamics for rental apartments in Canada. The Sub-Advisor trimmed The Toronto-Dominion Bank amid increased risk and negative sentiment surrounding the company as a result of its regulatory issues in the U.S.

Recent Developments

On March 25, 2024, Series FT6 and Series OT6 units of the Pool were made available for purchase.

The level of geopolitical risk disrupted the global economy and financial markets in unprecedented and unpredictable ways. This has resulted in significant volatility and uncertainty in financial markets. It is unclear what further actions may be taken by governments and the resulting impact on global economies, businesses and financial markets. These factors may adversely affect the Pool's performance. The Manager continues to monitor ongoing developments and the impact to investment strategies.

Related Party Transactions

Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce (*CIBC*) and its affiliates have the following roles and responsibilities with respect to the Pool, and receive the fees described below in connection with their roles and responsibilities.

Manager, Trustee, and Portfolio Advisor of the Pool CAMI, a wholly-owned subsidiary of CIBC, is the Pool's Manager, Trustee, and Portfolio Advisor. As Manager, CAMI receives management fees with respect to the Pool's day-to-day business and operations, calculated based on the net asset value of units of the Pool as described in Management Fees.

As Trustee, CAMI holds title to the Pool's property (cash and securities) on behalf of its unitholders. As Portfolio Advisor, CAMI provides, or arranges to provide investment advice and portfolio management services to the Pool. CAMI also compensates dealers in connection with their marketing activities regarding the Pool. From time to time, CAMI may invest in units of the Pool.

Portfolio Sub-Advisor

CAMI, in its capacity as Portfolio Advisor, has retained CIBC Wood Gundy, a division of CIBC World Markets Inc., to provide investment advice and portfolio management services to the Pool. As compensation for their services, CIBC Wood Gundy receives a fee from CAMI. CIBC World Markets Inc. is wholly-owned subsidiary of CIBC.

Distributor

Units of the Pool may be purchased only through CIBC Wood Gundy, a division of CIBC World Markets Inc. CAMI does not pay sales commissions and trailing commissions to CIBC Wood Gundy in connection with the sale of units of the Pool. At its discretion, CAMI may make units of the Pool available through other dealers.

Brokerage Arrangements and Soft Dollars

The Portfolio Advisor or any portfolio sub-advisors make decisions, including the selection of markets and dealers and the negotiation of commissions, with respect to the purchase and sale of portfolio securities, certain derivative products and the execution of portfolio transactions. Brokerage business may be allocated by the Portfolio Advisor or any portfolio sub-advisor(s) to CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp., each a subsidiary of CIBC. CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp. may also earn spreads on the sale of fixed income securities, other securities, and certain derivative products to the Pool. A spread is the difference between the bid and ask prices for a security in the applicable marketplace, with respect to the execution of portfolio transactions. The spread will differ based upon various factors such as the nature and liquidity of the security.

Dealers, including CIBC WM and CIBC World Markets Corp., may furnish goods and services, other than order execution, to the Portfolio Advisor or any portfolio sub-advisor(s) when they process trades through them. These types of goods and services for which the Portfolio Advisor or a portfolio sub-advisor may direct brokerage commissions are research goods and services and order execution goods and services, and are referred to in the industry as "soft-dollar" arrangements. These goods and services received through soft dollar arrangements assist the Portfolio Advisor or any portfolio sub-advisor(s) with investment decision-making services for the Pool, or relate directly to the execution of portfolio transactions on behalf of the Pool. As per the terms of the portfolio advisory agreement and portfolio sub-advisory agreements, such soft dollar arrangements are in compliance with applicable laws.

During the period, the Pool paid brokerage commissions and other fees of \$967 to CIBC WM; the Pool did not pay any brokerage commissions or other fees to CIBC World Markets Corp. Spreads associated with fixed income and other securities are not ascertainable and, for that reason, cannot be included when determining these amounts.

Pool Transactions

The Pool may enter into one or more of the following transactions (the *Related Party Transactions*) in reliance on the standing instructions issued by the Independent Review Committee (the *IRC*):

- invest in or hold equity securities of CIBC or issuers related to the Portfolio Advisor;
- invest in or hold non-exchange-traded debt securities of CIBC or an issuer related to CIBC, with terms-to-maturity of 365 days or more, issued in a primary offering and in the secondary market;
- make an investment in the securities of an issuer for which CIBC WM, CIBC World Markets Corp., or any affiliate of CIBC (a Related Dealer or the Related Dealers) acts as an underwriter during the offering of the securities or at any time during the 60-day period following the completion of the offering of such securities (in the

case of a "private placement" offering, in accordance with the Private Placement Relief Order and the policies and procedures relating to such investment);

- purchase equity or debt securities from, or sell them to, a Related Dealer, where it is acting as principal;
- undertake currency and currency derivative transactions where a related party is the counterparty;
- purchase securities from or sell securities to another investment fund or a managed account managed by the Manager or an affiliate (inter-fund trades or cross-trades); and
- engage in in-specie transfers by receiving portfolio securities from, or delivering portfolio securities to, a managed account or another investment fund managed by the Manager or an affiliate, in respect of a purchase or redemption of units of the Pool, subject to certain conditions.

At least annually, the IRC reviews the Related Party Transactions for which they have issued standing instructions. The IRC is required to advise the Canadian securities regulatory authorities, after a matter has been referred to or reported to it by the Manager, if it determines that an investment decision was not made in accordance with conditions imposed by securities legislation or the IRC in any Related Party Transactions requiring its approval.

Custodian

CIBC Mellon Trust Company is the custodian of the Pool (the *Custodian*). The Custodian holds cash and securities for the Pool and ensures that those assets are kept separate from any other cash or securities that the Custodian might be holding. The Custodian also provides other services to the Pool including record-keeping and processing foreign exchange transactions. The fees and spreads for the services of the Custodian are paid by the Manager. CIBC owns a 50% interest in the Custodian.

Service Provider

CIBC Mellon Global Securities Services Company Inc. (CIBC GSS) provides certain services to the Pool, including securities lending, fund accounting and reporting, and portfolio valuation. Such servicing fees are paid by the Manager. CIBC indirectly owns a 50% interest in CIBC GSS.

Spreads associated with fixed income securities trading are not ascertainable and, for that reason, are not included in the trading expense ratio calculation.
- The portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the portfolio advisor manages the portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to a pool buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the period. The higher a portfolio turnover rate in a period, the greater the trading costs payable by a pool in the period, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a pool.

Management Fees

The Pool, either directly or indirectly, pays CAMI an annual management fee to cover the costs of managing the Pool. Management fees are based on the Pool's net asset value and are calculated daily and paid monthly. Management fees are paid to CAMI in consideration for providing, or arranging for the provision of, management, distribution, and portfolio advisory services. Advertising and promotional expenses, office overhead expenses and trailing commissions are paid by CAMI out of the management fees received from the Pool. The Pool is required to pay applicable taxes on the management fees paid to CAMI. Refer to the Simplified Prospectus for the annual management fee rate for each series of units. For Series O and Series OT6 units, the management fee is negotiated with and paid by, or as directed by, unitholders or dealers and discretionary managers on behalf of unitholders. Such management fee for Series O and Series OT6 units will not exceed the annual management fee rate for Series F and Series FT6 units respectively.

For the period ended August 31, 2024, 100% of the management fees collected from the Pool was attributable to general administration and investment advice.

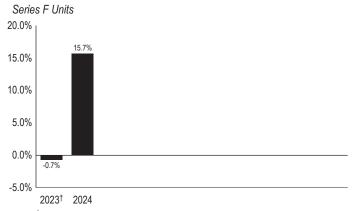

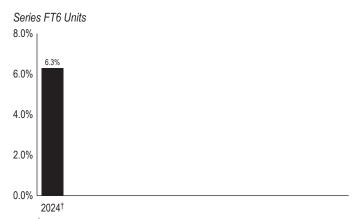

Year-by-Year Returns

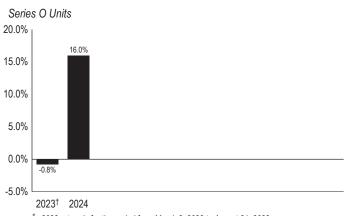
