

10	Admission Letter	Please upload the Acceptance / Letter of Admission you received from the Canadian school you will be attending. It is very important to have your Legal Name on this document. This can be uploaded in pdf or jpg format at a maximum size of 5 MB

6	Confirm Password	Enter your password again (i.e. the same password used in #3 and #4 above). Carefully review to ensure there are no errors, and confirm the password used for #5 (above) and #6 (here) match

Important Notes

- Once you submit your application, CIBC will begin the process of opening your new account. You can track your application online by signing on to the secure ISBO platform with your registered email address and the password you created
- CIBC will contact you within 1 business day via email to confirm your payment instructions. The instructions will include your newly established CIBC bank account number (i.e. where your international wire payments will be deposited)
- The international wire transfer must come from your bank account in India, China, Vietnam or the Philippines. Only one international wire transfer is permitted until you arrive in Canada and activate your account. If required, refunds can be requested on the ISBO online platform once you have submitted your wire transfer. We will ask why you need a refund, and will need to notify the Canadian Consulate of your request. The refund processing fee is \$20.00 per transaction
